Program Overview

The NextGen Service Summer Policy Academy (SPA) is a three-week program and professional development experience designed to empower undergraduate juniors to explore meaningful and impactful careers in public service.

What to Expect

Washington, DC Immersion, June 14 - 20

- Networking and mentorship opportunities with public service leaders and changemakers
- Personal reflection sessions to identify personal strengths and clarify career goals
- Site visits to national organizations and governmental agencies
- Exclusive visits to famous historical sites, such as the U.S. Capitol building and Smithsonian museums

Residential Study at a Host School, June 21 - July 3

- Develop practical policy analysis skills
- Engage in hands-on learning through case studies and simulations
- Collaborate with peers on real-world policy challenges
- Participate in field experiences and site visits
- Explore the campuses local area

University of Minnesota: Global Policy

With an emphasis on roleplay and simulation, students will take a hands-on approach in grappling with some of the world's most pressing transnational challenges. Specific areas of focus may include conflict, access to water, human rights, and sustainable development.

- U.S. Citizens or lawful permanent residents




Application Criteria
